The History of Morris Dancing

Morris dancing is an old English tradition. If you can think of any other English traditions still going, come and tell us and you may win a prize.

It started in the 15th century or earlier, but there are very few records. In 1494, Henry VII was entertained by "the Mourice dance", in 1458 a gilded cup engraved with Morris dancers was left in a will and in 1448 the Goldsmiths of London paid 7 shillings for "Moryssh dancers".



Villages in the Cotswolds and the Border counties (with Wales) had sides (teams) of Morris Dancers, with each having its own style or tradition. As the industrial revolution gradually reduced the rural population with a migration to the towns, it died out in the villages, but North West Morris evolved in the industrial towns.

Today Wickham Morris dance in the Cotswold and Border styles, plus several dances that we have created, thus continuing the evolution of the tradition.


