### The History of Wickham Morris

Morris dancing is a very ancient tradition passed down orally through the centuries.

Last year was Wickham Morris's 40th year since it first formed, and founder member Eric Bright remembers the early days:

In 1981 the young rector of Wickham, the late Colin George, suggested something entirely different for the annual church fete. A Morris side of 12 volunteers was formed and learned two dances in secret from Anjie Swayne, an ex dance instructor. On the day of the fete one dancer was held up in Germany due to a French air traffic controllers' strike but Anjie stepped into the breach and the performance was really well-received. The group decided to learn more dances and continued to perform in public, initially being known as the Wickham Cloggies. They went from strength to strength, with more dancers and musicians joining, including women, who were admitted, amongst some controversy, in 1994. Wickham Morris have now performed at festivals and events both in the UK and abroad, including in Maastricht and at the Millennium Dome in 1999, at the Olympics and in the Olympic Torch procession in 2012.
